<p>We have over 50 ADRA France local delegations all over the country, working with social issues they face (poverty, exclusion, food aid, cloths, homeless, etc.). They are regularly confronted with refugees at they activities. However, the local delegation of Dunkerque is working exclusively with refugees. In Dunkerque, there are 7 organisations that each day of the week, give a meal a day, the lunch, to refugees of the Grande-Synthe camp.</p> <p>ADRA France is responsible for lunch every Sundays.</p> <p>We provide meals, but also cloths, shoes, sleeping bags and others requests, according with the means.</p> <p>Usually there were around 50 to 60 people, and the</p>	<p>With the increase number of women and children, the main need in this camp are toilet and shower cabins. The platform of NGOs working with the refugees in Dunkerque, which is a member ADRA, is in contact with the Grande-Synthe Municipality, which promised to install those facilities soon.</p>	<p>ADRA France want to concentrate its efforts with the refugees' camp of Dunkerque. We work through our volunteers. In Dunkerque, we have a team of 20 volunteers.</p> <p>We are able to scale up our response capacity, according with the availability of funds and in accordance with the local authorities response.</p>	<p>Private donations</p>
